

Easton Primary School Annual Report to the Parish Council – 2024–2025

Chair, Councillors, and members of the community,

Thank you for the opportunity to share our annual report. Easton Primary School continues to thrive as a small, vibrant, and inclusive learning community at the heart of the village. We are proud to be educating 74 children not only from Easton but also from surrounding rural areas, offering them a nurturing environment in which they can learn, grow, and flourish.

School Overview

We currently have three mixed-age classes:

- **Hazel Class:** EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2
- **Rowan Class:** Years 3 and 4
- **Oak Class:** Years 5 and 6

Our values – *Creativity, Adaptability, Resilience, Kindness, and Curiosity* – underpin every aspect of school life, helping children to develop not just academically, but also socially and emotionally.

Academic Highlights

We continue to maintain high standards in reading and are working strategically to raise attainment and confidence in writing and mathematics. Our teaching approach is rooted in mastery, with a strong emphasis on reasoning, problem solving, and oracy.

The Year 6 cohort will sit their SATs in May, and we are proud of the progress they have made despite the challenges of recent years.

Curriculum and Enrichment

Our bespoke, creative curriculum supports deep learning across all subjects. This year's highlights include:

- **Science and Nature:** Active participation in our *Triangle of Life* garden space.
- **History and Geography:** A residential trip to Derbyshire and local trips to Sutton Hoo and Kentwell Hall.
- **The Arts:** Whole-school performances, choir events, and participation in the *Long Shop Sound Machine* project with the City of London Sinfonia.
- **PE and Wellbeing:** A broad PE curriculum complemented by extracurricular clubs and regular outdoor learning opportunities, including Forest Schools.

Our *Peter Pan the Musical* summer production is currently in rehearsal, with children taking on roles across drama, singing, set design and technical support.

Community and Environment

The **Triangle of Life**, our developing garden space, has gone from strength to strength thanks to the dedication of parent volunteers, led by Melanie Gibson. Pupils have grown vegetables, created habitats for wildlife, and taken part in the *Field to Fork* initiative. We are seeking to expand community involvement to support the long-term sustainability of this project.

We are also proud winners of the **Zellar Green Schools** competition, receiving a £1,000 prize to support our environmental efforts.

Safeguarding and Wellbeing

The safety and wellbeing of our pupils remains our highest priority. We continue to focus on supporting children's emotional and social development through our PSHE curriculum, small group interventions, and close collaboration with families.

Community Engagement

We value our relationship with the wider Easton community and continue to strengthen these ties through:

- Open days and community assemblies
- Choir and music performances
- Inviting community members to share expertise with children
- Plans to involve more volunteers in gardening and reading

We welcome ideas from the Parish Council and community on how we might deepen these connections further.
