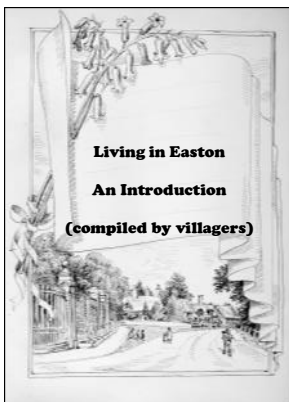

## Preparing for Spring

March is always a month of quiet anticipation in Central Suffolk and North Ipswich. The days begin to stretch a little longer, the first signs of new life appear in the hedgerows, and across our countryside there is a renewed sense of purpose as we prepare for spring.

For many of our local farming families, March means lambing season. It is a time of hard work, long hours, and real dedication. There is something deeply reassuring about seeing newborn lambs in the fields, a reminder of the enduring rhythms of rural life and the vital role our farms play in feeding the nation. Behind every familiar Suffolk landscape is the commitment of farmers who care for their animals and their land with skill passed down through generations.

Alongside lambing comes the start of early planting. ## **THE WILDLIFE GARDEN**

Focus on supporting wildlife during the "hungry gap" by continuing to feed birds, protecting emerging amphibians and planting early nectar sources.

Resist the urge to tidy up completely as dead leaves and stems provide essential shelter for beneficial insects and ladybirds.

Avoid disturbing early nesting birds.

Hedgehogs will be coming out of hibernation now so ensure there is food and fresh water available.

Look out for frog and toad spawn.

## **GARDENING TIPS**

Divide and replant overgrown clumps of perennials.

Top dress and feed containers to give them a boost.

Feed and mulch roses.

Tidy borders by clearing old perennial growth, adding mulch and a spring feed.

Sow hardy annuals.

Pot up dahlia tubers under cover.

March is a busy time in the garden as everything starts growing at speed. Take a moment to enjoy the season.

Easton is hosting the benefice service of Holy Communion on 1<sup>st</sup> March at 11.00 am.

On Mothing Sunday (15<sup>th</sup> March) the services are: Holy Communion at Marlesford 9.30 am with Parham and Campsea Ashe, and at 11.00 am Morning Worship at Kettleburgh with Brandeston and Easton.

On Passion Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> March there will be Holy Communion in Easton Village Hall at 9.30 am.

Palm Sunday is 29<sup>th</sup> March when there will be a Benefice Holy Communion at Hacheston at 11.00 am, followed by coffee and hot cross buns in the Village Hall there (where there is plenty of parking).

On Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> March Easton is hosting a Taizé service for Holy Week at 7.00 pm.

An Agape meal is planned for Maundy Thursday at 7.00 pm in Kettleburgh Village Hall, which will include Holy Communion.

On Good Friday there is a service at 10.00 am retelling the passion story. This is a child-friendly service with activities. And at 2.00pm there is a Service of the Final Hour at Campsea Ashe

Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> April is Easter Day when there will be a short sunrise service at Brandeston at 5.55 am, Holy Communion at Marlesford at 8.00 am and Holy Communion at Parham at 10.00 am.

# Psalms

**The Orebeck Benefice group of churches, of which All Saints in Easton is a member, will be running a special Lent course on the Psalms led by the Benefice Rector, the Rev. Ann Kember.**

**The course will run on Monday afternoons on the following dates: 2<sup>nd</sup> March; 9<sup>th</sup> March; 16<sup>th</sup> March; 23<sup>rd</sup> March; 30<sup>th</sup> March. All the sessions will be at Hacheston Village Hall, starting at 2:30pm, and each session will be followed by a short optional service of Evening Prayer at 4.00 pm.**

**In each of the five sessions we will be focusing on individual psalms, reflecting on them and reading modern poems inspired by the psalms. You may even even have a chance to write some of our own!**

**Each session is self-contained, so you're free to attend as many or as few sessions as you wish.**

**The course will, we hope, encourage individual reflections and it would be good if you could bring a notebook so you can record your thoughts and responses in whatever form you like.**

### Message from Suffolk Constabulary

#### Heating Oil Security – Keep Your Fuel Safe

Due to a recent heating oil theft on The Street, Beddingfield between the 30th January and the 1st February 2026, we would like to highlight generally the importance of Heating Oil Security to you all, no matter where you are in our area. With colder weather, many of us are topping up our heating oil. It's a valuable resource—so it's worth taking a few simple steps to keep it secure:

- Lock your tank – Use a high quality lock or specialist tank lock to deter opportunists.
- Install motion activated lights or CCTV – Most thieves avoid well lit, visible areas.
- Hide from view – Use fencing, trellis, or shrubs to make your tank less obvious.
- Keep an eye out – Report any suspicious vehicles or activity near fuel tanks.

Heating oil theft tends to rise during the winter months, but a few precautions can make a big difference. Stay warm, stay safe, and look after your property and one another.

#### Suffolk police warn of courier fraud targeting elderly following recent reports

Police are urging families, friends and neighbours to make their elderly relatives or vulnerable members of the community aware of courier fraud after two incidents were reported to police this week.

Courier fraud occurs when people are contacted by people pretending to be police officers or bank officials and are duped into handing over money, valuables or bank cards which are collected from their home address, often by couriers. The criminals use a variety of different tactics, often claiming that there is a problem with your account and they need your help to catch the real criminals. During the initial phone call they may ask you for your PIN or ask you to key it into your phone. No bank or other legitimate service will ever ask you for your PIN.

The first incident occurred in the mid Suffolk area, the second incident in west Suffolk.

Both involved female victims aged in their 80s who are reported to have lost a significant sum of money.

Police are urging residents to share this warning with elderly and vulnerable family members, friends and neighbours – but stress that anyone can fall victim to these sophisticated scams.

Police officers will never:

- Ask for bank details or PINs
- Request cash or bank card handovers to couriers
- Demand money transfers to other accounts
- Ask for payment of fines or fees over the phone
- Request access to your computer or passwords
- Ask you to 'assist' in an investigation by doing any of the above.

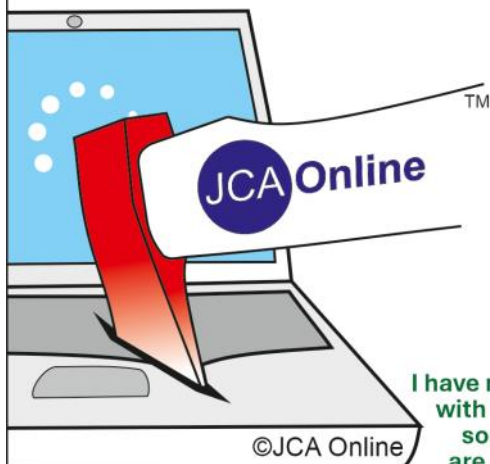
